The MIRANDA project engages stakeholders through national workshops across partner countries

The MIRANDA Erasmus+ Project successfully implemented a series of national **stakeholder workshops** across the participating countries during August 2026, as part of **Work Package 5 (WP5)** and the project's dissemination and stakeholder engagement activities.

The workshops brought together a diverse range of stakeholders working in the fields of Roma inclusion, education, and Vocational Education and Training (VET). Participants included educational policymakers, VET providers and professionals, non-governmental organisations, Roma associations, labour market representatives, researchers, experts, and civil society organisations.

To ensure broad and relevant participation, project partners utilized the **Stakeholders Database** developed earlier within Work Package 2 (WP2). This approach created a strong connection between the project's stakeholder mapping activities and its final dissemination and engagement efforts, facilitating meaningful dialogue with key actors at local, national, and regional levels.

The workshops served as a platform to present the MIRANDA project and showcase its main achievements and outputs. Participants had the opportunity to exchange experiences, discuss good practices, and provide feedback on the project's results and their applicability within different educational and vocational contexts.

Particular emphasis was given to the ongoing challenges related to Roma inclusion in education and VET, while also exploring opportunities for future collaboration and the sustainability of project outcomes beyond the project's completion.

Through presentations, open discussions, networking opportunities, and feedback sessions, stakeholders actively shared their perspectives, experiences, and recommendations, providing valuable insights into the practical relevance and potential impact of the project's results.

The successful implementation of these workshops marks an important step in strengthening cooperation among key stakeholders and ensuring the long-term sustainability of the MIRANDA project's achievements. The feedback collected will support the continued promotion of



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inclusive educational practices and contribute to future initiatives aimed at enhancing opportunities for Roma learners across Europe.

These stakeholder engagement activities reinforce the project's commitment to fostering collaboration, inclusion, and lasting impact within the fields of education and vocational training.
